

**OUR LADY OF THE LAKE COLLEGE**  
**STATISTICAL PROFILE**  
*Calendar Year 2015*

- **Programs Offered** – Programs available for students admitted for enrollment included: 1 doctoral degree, 4 master’s degrees, 6 bachelor’s degrees, and 4 associate-level degree programs. Additionally, 1 non-degree/certificate program was offered.
- **Student Enrollment** – Spring 1699 (85% female, 15% male); Summer 791 (83% female, 17% male); Fall 1687 (86% female, 14% male).
- **Credit Hours** – The College generated 39,560 student credit hours in 2015 (17,787 in spring; 4,605 in summer; 17,168 in fall).
- **Program Enrollment** – During the fall semester, 90% of students were enrolled in undergraduate academic degree programs, 9% were in graduate degree programs, and 1% was enrolled in technical programs. Seventy-two percent of students were enrolled as majors in the School of Nursing; 9% in the School of Arts and Sciences and 19% in the School of Health Professions (this includes enrollment in non-degree programs).
- **Age Characteristics** – The average age of students at OLOL College is 28. Seventy-six percent of the student body is under 30 years of age, and 8% is over 40 years of age.
- **Ethnicity Characteristics** – Thirty-three percent of those attending OLOL College self-identify as U.S. Students of Color: 17.9% Black or African American; 3.1% Asian; 11% Hispanic; .3% Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander; and .5% American Indian/Alaska Native.
- **Geographic Distribution** – Sixty-five percent of the student body lists their parish of residence as East Baton Rouge (38%) or a parish within a 75-mile radius, primarily Ascension, Livingston, Tangipahoa or Jefferson. Out-of-state student enrollment continues to increase gradually year over year. In the fall of 2015, 223 students (13%) were from states other than Louisiana.
- **Degrees Conferred** – Our Lady of the Lake College awarded 446 academic degrees in 2015. Following the spring semester, 220 degrees were awarded (26% associate; 58% baccalaureate; 15% masters). Completion of the summer term led to 47 additional degree conferrals (100% baccalaureate). Completion of the fall semester led to 179 additional degree conferrals (77% baccalaureate; 23% master’s). Eleven certificates and diplomas were awarded to students completing non-degree programs throughout the year.
- **Faculty** – The College employs 76 full-time faculty members (both 10-month and 12-month contract), laboratory instructors/coordinators, and draws as needed from a pool of well qualified professionals who serve as adjunct faculty.
- **Staff** – College constituencies are served by 95 professional and support staff members in enrollment services, academic affairs, counseling, financial aid, business affairs, development, institutional effectiveness, library, technology, and administrative support positions including extra duty Baton Rouge police officers and non-work study student workers. This also includes Deans.
- **Budget** – The College’s operating budget for Fiscal Year 2015 was \$24,181,259. In addition, the College continues to receive the Title III Part A Strengthening Institutions Program Grant of approximately \$400,000 a year for five years starting in October 2011. This funds end in October of 2016.
- **Physical Plant** – The College occupied twelve buildings near Our Lady of the Lake Regional Medical Center in South Baton Rouge.
